SPOTS FOR YOUR DISCOVERY

BURFORD

25 min drive (12 miles)

Burford is famous for its buzzing high street which sweeps downhill towards the River Windrush. Discover the medieval bridge and mighty church, with both sides of the high street flanked by an unbroken line of historic houses, independent shops and boutiques.

BIBURY

38 min drive (23 miles)

A charming Cotswold village just a short drive along the country rounds from Cirencester. William Morris (1834-96) once described Bibury as “the most beautiful village in England”.

BOURTON-ON-THE-WATER

40 min drive (24 miles)

One of the most popular and certainly prettiest destinations in the Cotswolds. In the 17th century, the river was diverted through the centre of the village to power three mills, one of which is now home to the Motor Museum.

CHARLBURY

17 min drive (6 miles)

A charming Cotswold market town with honey-stone cottages, independent cafés and winding streets. Stop by for antiques, artisan bakeries and a quintessential countryside setting.

LAVENDER FIELDS

57 min drive (30 miles)

In the height of summer, rolling lavender fields burst into bloom across the Oxfordshire countryside. Fragrant rows of violet stretch across the landscape, offering a beautiful picnic stop! *Please note that a small entrance fee applies. Open during the summer months only.*

BLenheim PALACE

14 min drive (6 miles)

One of England's most iconic estates, Blenheim Palace offers sweeping parkland, grand baroque architecture and beautifully kept gardens. A scenic stop steeped in British history and grandeur.



PLACES TO DINE ALONG THE WAY

THE ROYAL OAK, RAMSDEN

10 min drive (4 miles)

A cosy traditional Cotswold pub nestled in the quaint village of Ramsden. The Royal Oak has been referred to as a blueprint for the perfect low-key bolt hole with an array of different cultural dining experiences throughout the year.

THE BULL, CHARLBURY

15 min drive (7 miles)

The Bull has been standing on the corner of Sheep Street since the early 16th century. The menu takes a nose-to-tail approach with open-fire cooking, a rustic, rural-chic interior and a commendable reputation.

THE DOUBLE RED DUKE, CLANFIELD

35 min drive (12 miles)

Referred to as “a place of kick-back cool”, The Double Red Duke is renowned for its atmospheric open-fire cooking, interactive dining and vibrant feel. A true hidden gem on the eastern fringes of the Cotswolds, with homely and inviting interiors.

OXMOOR FARM, GREAT HAMPDEN

1 hour drive (35 miles)

Steeped in history with buildings reminiscent of times past and nestled in the Chiltern Hills, Oxmoor Farm offers bountiful views of the surrounding ancient woodland, alongside wild feasting with guest chefs and farm-to-table dining, featuring award-winning Neapolitan pizzas.

THE OLD BUTCHERS, STOW-ON-THE-WOLD

38 min drive (23 miles)

A much-loved neighbourhood restaurant in Stow-on-the-Wold, known for seasonal British dishes, warm interiors and a relaxed atmosphere. Expect comforting plates and understated countryside charm.

THE FOX, ODDINGTON

39 min drive (19 miles)

A charming Cotswold pub blending rustic character with refined, seasonal British cuisine. With cosy interiors and an elevated menu, The Fox is ideal for long lunches and fireside drinks.

THE FALKLAND ARMS, GREAT TEW

28 min drive (13 miles)

Often described as one of the prettiest pubs in England, The Falkland Arms is steeped in old-world charm with stone floors, timber beams and a wonderfully traditional feel in the heart of Great Tew.

QUINCE AND CLOVER, GREAT TEW

28 min drive (13 miles)

A thoughtfully curated lifestyle store and café space celebrating craftsmanship and interiors. Discover artisan homewares, seasonal flowers and carefully sourced pieces inspired by the countryside.
